WHAT'S CHANGED THIS YEAR?

Thanks, again, for your letters, emails, comments, queries and concerns. We have made a few more changes and tweaks this year. Please let us know how we are doing by filling in a feedback questionnaire available at every venue.

AGES are recognised as 1st September 2020. (i.e. How old am I on that date?).

Key stages are as follows:-

KS1 = Age 5 to 7. KS2 = 7 to 11. KS3 = 11 to 14. KS4 = 14 to 16. KS5 = 16 to 18.

VENUE

This year, all the classes will be in The Freemasons' Hall in Knole Road.

SYLLABUS

All the syllabus details are on the web site, but we will happily send you a printed copy of the Dance or MSD syllabus, or both, for £3 each (including postage).

<u>SPEECH & DRAMA</u> in The Christie Room, Freemasons' Hall. Groups larger than 6 people will be moved to the Hampshire Room.

<u>INSTRUMENTALS</u> in The Hampshire Room, Freemasons' Hall. After some success with the introduction of some classes by Key Stage, your suggestions have recommended that we try a mixture of both Key Stage and Grade. Let us know how you get on with this combination.

<u>YOUNG MUSICIAN OF THE YEAR</u> will take place this year in the Pavilion Theatre on the evening of Friday 26th June. We will be advertising this event more widely than in the past and expect to draw in an audience to appreciate the skills of our local instrumentalists.

VOCALS in The Hampshire Room, Freemasons' Hall.

We have selected a different set of classes for The Hubert Parry Award of £250 for solo singers up to the age of 35.

This year's 'Theme' class will be any song where a colour is mentioned in the lyrics.

PAYMENT FOR YOUR CLASSES

Direct BACS transfer will again be available this year. Please remember to quote a Reference and your email address on the entry form so we tie your BACS payment to your entry.

RULES

There have been a few minor tweaks this year. It's worth having a look through them just in case your entries are affected. We have included them with this year's syllabus, and the rules are, of course, available to view and download from our web site. Please take special note of the clarification to the timings rules, especially drama students. Also, elimination will no longer be a 'punishment', but the adjudicator will be asked to reflect any overrun by a deduction of marks.

PRICES

No price increases this year, although we have re-aligned one or two.

<u>YOUR EMAIL ADDRESS</u> is important to us. The fact that we put our syllabuses on the internet means that you don't have to pay for it. INSTRUMENTALS ADJUDICATOR BEN COSTELLO



Ben is a freelance musical director, artistic director, adjudicator, singing coach and accompanist, working internationally. He is also Artistic Director of Thames Concerts, Musical Director of Southampton Choral Society, Founding Director of Kingston Chamber Singers, Chorus Master for the Leith Hill Musical Festival, on the faculty at Laine Theatre Arts, and over a twenty-year career has been musical director on numerous theatre productions across the U.K.

He is a guest conductor and workshop leader with various choirs, and as an accompanist and coach collaborates with countless singers and instrumentalists. His early career included répétiteur

work for London opera companies and ensembles including the London Symphony Orchestra. He is a specialist in musical theatre, with his work in that field embracing musical direction, singing teaching, accompanying and dramaturgy.

Ben has worked extensively for leading colleges including Arts Ed (London), Mountview Academy, Guildford School of Acting, Laine Theatre Arts and the London College of Music, together with the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art, Trinity Laban, Drama Studio London, the Royal Academy of Music, and the universities of London, Surrey, Kingston and Portsmouth. Countless of his former students enjoy successful careers in the West End and beyond. Born and based in London, Ben trained initially as a flautist, before majoring in piano, singing and conducting. He is a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Musicians, organising and chairing the Company's annual musical direction scholarship. Outside of music he is a keen motorcyclist.

Ben comes to us with a great reputation, and we are absolutely thrilled to welcome him to Bournemouth.

SPEECH & DRAMA ADJUDICATOR JENNY THORNTON



Jenny trained at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, gaining awards for Character Acting and Most Promising Teacher.

Jenny has led the Performing Arts Teams in a large comprehensive school, been an Assistant Principal for Edexcel, LAMDA examiner and now enjoys running her own Performance Centre with ages from 4 years to adults delivering drama, dance and musical theatre and also writing. Her play called "Gone" gained a Commended when performed at The Orange Tree Theatre in Richmond as did her most recent play "Young Love".

She was delighted when LAMDA chose two of her pieces for their new acting anthology. Her most recent teaching experience is working in a state school as a peripatetic teacher as part of her "Outreach" programme extending the work of the Richmond Festival for which she is the secretary. "Drama is a life skill that changed me from a stuttering introvert to a confident individual. We can give our children no better opportunity."

CHORAL AND VOCAL ADJUDICATOR MARIA JAGUSZ



Maria was last with us in 2013, when she proved very popular with our vocalists. This year, she will be adjudicating the choirs as well as the vocals, and we are delighted to welcome her back.

She trained as a dancer before taking up a place at the Royal Northern College of Music where she was awarded the Ricordi Prize for Opera. Further scholarships enabled her to continue her studies at the National Opera Studio. As a singer Maria has worked as soloist for most of the leading opera companies in the U.K and Europe. Her roles include Carmen, Cherubino, Orlofsky, Hansel, Dorabella and Rosina.

She has performed with many of the world's leading singers including Domingo, Carreras, Freni and Dame Felicity Lott. Her last role was Filipevna in Eugene Onegin for Mid Wales Opera this spring. She is a keen recitalist and a regular soloist for choral societies in the U.K.

As a teacher Maria has specialised in training students who are hoping to have professional careers in the world of opera and musical theatre. As part of their training Maria believes that getting as much performing experience both in concert and on stage is vital for the development of young talent. She arranges many concerts both in the Cotswolds and in Cornwall where young singers can get the chance to perform in a safe welcoming environment.

Maria has worked for the education department for Longborough Festival Opera for the past ten years. She has just completed over thirty workshops introducing opera to schoolchildren. For their Young Artist Programme she has directed Little Sweep, Dido and Aeneas, La Boheme, Sweeney Todd and Les Miserables and most recently Gluck's Orfeo Ed Euridice.

She travels all over the country leading workshops and master classes for singers. Her work with amateur choirs and singers has led to her directing choral works and operettas for "Music Festival At Sea". Her latest production of The Mikado combined the skills of professional singers and performers with a large choir of willing passengers.

She has been awarded honorary chairman of the Silurian Consort for her contribution to music in the Cotswolds.

The safety of children and vulnerable adults is paramount and all, without exception, have the right to protection from abuse. All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately and all the charity's trustees and volunteers have a responsibility to report concerns.

1. PURPOSE & FUNCTION OF THE FESTIVAL

The object of the Festival is to advance the education of the general public in the Arts, particularly the Arts of Music, Speech and Dance, by providing a public platform for amateur performance, coupled with the assessment of that performance by professional Adjudicators.

2. THE FESTIVAL ENVIRONMENT

<u>Queen Elizabeth's School</u> Wimborne is a Secondary School, with all festival activities taking place in the main hall and adjoining classrooms. Although the Festival is held during half term week some school staff and students do visit the premises for project work.

<u>The Freemasons' Hall</u> is the privately owned Masonic Lodge where all classes will take place on the first floor in the Hampshire Room and the Christie Room. The Dorset Room, which is adjacent to the kitchen servery, will be used as a competitors' waiting area.

<u>The Pavilion Theatre</u> is a public theatre which has access to the general public and may have other activities happening in other parts of the premises.

The festival is run by volunteers.

It is our policy to inform and involve parents, guardians, carers and teachers in partnership with you in order to ensure, as far as it is reasonably practicable, a safe environment at the Festival.

3. TO WHOM DOES THIS POLICY APPLY?

This policy relates to all children under the age of 18 years, and members of vulnerable groups of any age whose needs are identified to the festival organisers prior to their arrival at the Festival. This should be done by contacting the address or telephone number shown in the heading of this document. Our Festival actively seeks, wherever possible, to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support – or to let you know we are unable to help.

4. FESTIVAL PERSONNEL

The volunteers are recruited, and approved by the Trustees, from people who have shown an interest in the Festival, and have offered to give their time. They indicate the sort of tasks that they would prefer to undertake.

All stewards are provided with a short job description for the duties they carry out, and, where necessary, every steward is subject to a formal DBS check. This applies to all our trustees and those stewards who take responsibility for competitors on an individual basis.

The duty rota for each day is on display at each Festival venue. Each volunteer on duty will wear a badge. The Duty Officer in charge of the session will wear a distinctive badge. Anyone wearing a badge may be approached in case of a problem and will be able to direct you to the responsible person who will deal with it.

At each venue there will be an office available where problems or concerns can be heard and dealt with in private. All problems will be taken seriously and will be documented and dated.

5. PREPARATION FOR ATTENDANCE AT THE FESTIVAL

We are informing parents/quardians/carers of this policy by the following means:

- a) A copy of this Policy is included in the syllabus. Teachers are expected to take responsibility for seeing that parents, guardians or carers in charge of their pupils are aware of this Policy and to inform the Festival Organiser that they accept this responsibility by signing the entry form.
- b) Copies of the Policy are on display at the Festival venues and on our website www.bmcf.info.

When parents/guardians/carers are not personally attending with their children, this Policy requires them to be satisfied that their children will be accompanied to the festival and adequately supervised at all times by a responsible adult acting on their behalf. This includes being taken between dressing rooms and the stage.

6. PERFORMANCE AREAS & CHANGING ROOMS

Backstage areas at the Festival will be supervised by DBS accredited volunteers. Access to these areas is prohibited except in the presence of the stage manager on duty.

Areas for changing will not be supervised. Those volunteers who may be called upon to visit these areas for any reason will have received appropriate clearance. Supervision of children and/or vulnerable adults in all other parts of the Festival venue is the responsibility of teachers and/or parents/carers.

7. PHOTOGRAPHS, VIDEOTAPES AND PRESS PHOTOGRAPHY

No photography or recording of any kind is permitted at the Festival, except by the Official Festival Photographer (who has received clearance from DBS) or the Press (by arrangement).

It is the responsibility of parents who do not wish their child to be photographed to ensure the child does not take part when photography is in progress.

8. POLICY REVIEW

The Organisers will constantly review their Policy, improving and enhancing it as necessary. In doing this, they will look to the British and International Federation of Festivals for support and that body, in turn, will look to other agencies for good practice.

MUSIC, SPEECH AND DRAMA (MSD) FESTIVAL RULES

Items in italics are recently changed

1. ELIGIBILITY

- 1.1. Classes, other than where specified in the syllabus are restricted to amateurs. An amateur is considered to be one who does not derive the main part of his/her income from that section of art in which he/she wishes to compete. A teacher, however their income is derived, may not compete in classes related to subjects that they teach. Teachers and professionals may act as accompanists to musicians at every level.
- 1.2. Choirs, orchestras and bands should include only bona fide members.
- 1.3. Performers under 18 years of age are not eligible to compete in adult classes unless stated.
- 1.4. The date we use for all events is 1st September. For Dance this is 2019, but for all other events it's 2020. (i.e. How old am I on this date?).
 - KS1 = Age 5 to 7. KS2 = 7 to 11. KS3 = 11 to 14. KS4 = 14 to 16. KS5 = 16 to 18.
 - These are based on the Primary, Secondary and Advanced Education structure.
- 1.5. The date for Safeguarding for all competitors is the first day of the first competition in each year (i.e. not reached their 18th birthday).

2. ENTRIES

- 2.1. A performer may enter only once in any solo class and may not perform in any duet/trio or group class more than twice unless otherwise stated.
- 2.2. Performers' names should not be changed after entry. NOTE: A substitution can only be made if the festival is notified before the start of the Festival.
- 2.3. Entries received after the closing date for entries (as shown on the entry form) will not be accepted.
- 2.4. Entry fees will be refunded only in the case of a cancelled class or withdrawal due to illness where a medical certificate has been produced.
- 2.5. The responsibility for entering the appropriate class lies entirely with the performer and/or teacher concerned.
- 2.6. Date of birth must be given, when required.
- 2.7. **You are strongly advised** to keep a copy of the completed Entry Form for your reference.
- 2.8. Class numbers must always be quoted when making an enquiry.

3. TIME LIMITS

- 3.1. All introductions are to be included in the timing, except where specifically stated. In wind and string classes, a tuning time of up to 2 minutes is allowed. Ideally, the waiting area should be used to tune up prior to starting your performance.
- 3.2. The maximum time limit must not be exceeded.
- 3.3. The adjudicator may choose to take into account any entry where the performance lasts less than half the maximum permitted time. This does not apply where an instrumentalist plays a piece set for examination.
- 3.3.1. All performers may, if they choose, perform more than one piece, provided the total time limit is not exceeded.
- 3.4. Where time limits are not adhered to, our steward will inform the adjudicator who will deduct marks from the score achieved before announcing the class results.

4. CUPS, TROPHIES AND AWARDS

- 4.1. Cups and trophies specified in the syllabus will be awarded, subject to their return by the previous winner. A minimum category of MERIT must be obtained in order to win awards in the Music, Speech and Drama Sections.
- 4.2. Normally, a first, second and third place will be announced by the adjudicator in all classes. However, in classes where there are only a small number of competitors, the adjudicator may use his/her discretion to award only a first and second place, or only a first place.
- 4.3. Winners of cups and trophies are responsible for any loss or damage, and must arrange for them to be returned in a clean condition to the listed address NO LATER THAN 1ST MAY in the year following its award. (Please ring 01202 556023 to arrange delivery). If you would prefer, we will look after your trophy for you.
- 4.4. Winners may have their names engraved on a cup or trophy at their own expense.
- 4.5. All winners of solo classes will be awarded two tickets to the end-of-festival celebration concert.

5. ADJUDICATORS

- 5.1. In all matters of adjudication, the Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 5.2. The Adjudicator has the full power to withhold categories, to terminate any performance if the content is thought to be unsuitable, or to disqualify any performer who does not abide by the Festival rules.
- 5.3. No person, other than a steward, is allowed to communicate with an Adjudicator during classes.

6. POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE

- 6.1. The decision of the committee, except in matters of adjudication, shall be final and may at its sole discretion:
 - 6.1.1. Change the date, time or place of any class.
 - 6.1.2. Cancel, divide or amalgamate classes. If a class is cancelled fees will be refunded.
 - 6.1.3. Make such alterations as it thinks necessary or desirable, including the appointment of an alternative Adjudicator.
 - 6.1.4. Disqualify any performer failing to comply with the Festival rules.
 - 6.1.5. Refuse any entry without assigning a reason.
 - 6.1.6. Request the removal from the vicinity of the hall (by a steward) of anyone using audio, video or photographic equipment, or in any way causing a disturbance, in the interest of performers and their performance.

7. ON ARRIVAL AT YOUR VENUE

- 7.1. Performers must always check in to the competitors' table with the appropriate paperwork at least 15 minutes before the start of their class.
- 7.2. Performers should be aware that under certain circumstances their class may start up to 10 minutes before the scheduled time.
- 7.3. Performers must be ready to perform in the order in which they appear in the programme, unless a request has been made at the competitors' table well in advance to appear in a different order.

8. DANCE PERFORMERS

This section does not apply to MSD performers.

9. MUSIC PERFORMERS

- 9.1. Performers must provide their own instrument and music stand. A piano is provided for all vocal, choral and instrumental classes.
- 9.2. Performers must provide their own accompanist. Entrants are advised that the BMCF does not engage official accompanists, but if an entrant experiences difficulties they should contact the Festival. Accompanists will be admitted free of charge. See also "Looking for an Accompanist" on our web site.
- 9.3. Pre-recorded backing **may not** be used to accompany choral or instrumental classes. However, in vocal classes, a pre-recorded backing track of ONE PIANO may be provided and played on your own equipment. IT IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY THAT YOU BRING THE SHEET MUSIC FOR OUR ADJUDICATOR.
- 9.4. No song may be sung in more than one class by the same performer, though a piece may be repeated in a Recital or Championship class.
- 9.5. A performer entering a graded class must be, or must have been, preparing to take the specified grade, or working on music at a standard set for that grade in the current academic year (September to August). A piece need not be a piece set for examination, but a recognised graded piece must be played in that specified grade.
- 9.6. Solo performers may not play in more than one grade on the same instrument in each section, except in the recital classes (where grading is not recognised).
- 9.7. Duets (played or sung) must be predominantly harmony or part-singing, and **must not be performed by anyone who exceeds the grade entered**. The piece selected shall be validated as appropriate for the class by the adjudicator. Unison duets are not considered suitable.

9.8. OWN CHOICE FORMS (MUSIC ONLY)

- 9.8.1. Own Choice Forms for music selections can be downloaded from our website unless they have been requested on the entry form, and each performer must:-
 - 9.8.1.1. Attach the completed Own Choice Form to a copy of the music for the adjudicator, and hand this to the competitors' table at least 15 minutes before the start of the class. Please be sure to identify on this form whether this music should be returned or destroyed (see copyright section).

- 9.8.1.2. Clearly mark all music with the performer's name and class number and clearly indicate the starting page.
- 9.8.1.3. Suitably join photocopied music for the adjudicator and NOT provide loose sheets.

10. SPEECH & DRAMA PERFORMERS

- 10.1. Performers must bring any texts (other than pre-set texts) with them for the adjudicator. They must be presented in a tidy, legible form clearly marked with the class number and the performer's name and handed in to the competitors' table at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.
- 10.2. The adjudicator may choose to deduct marks if the language or the context of your text is deemed unacceptable at the festival. If in any doubt, please submit your text to the Organiser at least one month before your class so that appropriate scheduling can be arranged
- 10.3. Props and costumes are not required. A small selection of tables and chairs, plus a screen are pre-set on the stage and may be moved by the competitor, with the help of our steward if required. This may be done prior to the clock running. However, during championship classes, please remember that *once the clock is running*, moving of these items is included in your timing (see also rule 3).
- 10.4. All classes may be one piece only, unless specifically stated.
- 10.5. Any composition piece not submitted to the festival by the date specified in the syllabus will be excluded.

11. GENERAL INFORMATION

11.1. Copyright and Photocopying

- 11.1.2. The laws for copyright are strict. In many circumstances, the festival is covered by a specific licence through the British and International Federation of Festivals (BIFF).
- 11.1.3. Please refer to the federation web site www.federationoffestivals.org/copyright if you have any concerns, or contact them at 01625 428297.
- 11.1.4. For music competitors, the Own Choice form asks you to identify if you own permission to have your music returned after your performance. All music not specifically claiming ownership will be destroyed at the end of the Festival.

11.2. Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults

- 11.2.1. This is governed by the Festival's policy.
- 11.2.2. The policy is on our website and is also included in our syllabus for copying and distribution by teachers to parents/guardians of each entrant who has not reached their 18th birthday. It is important that all persons attending note the following:
 - 11.2.2.i. The use of equipment, including mobile phones, to make recordings or take photographs in the hall and during performances is <u>strictly forbidden</u> unless specifically agreed <u>in writing</u> beforehand with the Festival Organiser or the BMCF Safeguarding Officer. Performers whose performances are otherwise recorded will be disqualified.
 - 11.2.2.ii. Periodically a press photographer may visit.

 Please be sure to 'tick' the "No Photographs" box on the Entry Form if you do not want you, or your entrants to appear in published photographs.
 - 11.2.2.iii. Names of class winners may be published in the local press, on our Facebook page and, occasionally, our website. Parents/guardians must inform the Festival Duty Officer if they wish a name to be withheld.
- 11.2.3. If parents have any concerns please contact the Duty Officer.

11.3. Liability/Lost Property

The organisers of the Festival will not accept any liability for the loss or damage to personal property brought to the Festival. Lost Property should be reclaimed before the close of the Festival, or within 4 weeks of the end of the Festival.

THIS FESTIVAL IS OPEN TO ALL AMATEUR PERFORMERS FROM ANYWHERE IN THE WORLD.

Irrespective of which classes you want to enter, you'll need an Entry Form, and once you've filled it in, post it to us at BMCF, Rosscourt Hotel, 6 St John's Road, Bournemouth BH5 1EL.

Our entry form caters for all entries, including solos and groups.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO SHOW YOUR CURRENT EMAIL ADDRESS

METHODS OF PAYMENT

HOW DO I KNOW MY ENTRY HAS BEEN RECEIVED?

Payment by BACS:- We will email you. Please put your email address on your entry form.

SPECIAL REQUESTS

If you have any special requests (e.g. I can't come on Tuesday), then please say so on the entry form and, whilst we can't guarantee it, we will do our best to accommodate all these requests.

TIMETABLE

Approximately two weeks after the entry closing date, we'll publish the timetable on the website. It will show the class numbers and when they will take place. It may seem obvious, but we can't really produce an accurate timetable until we know how many entries there are in any class. If you can't get to the web site, we will post the timetable to you if you enclose a self-addressed **C5** envelope and the appropriate fee with your entry form.

Please note that, for security reasons, we do not publish the competitors' names on the timetable, just the classes and when they are taking place.

PROGRAMME

About one month before the competition, we produce a programme which has all the competitors' names and the order in which they will compete. This order is completely random and has nothing to do with the order in which we receive the entries. Sometimes, we shuffle the order to try to ensure that you're not the last performer in one class and the first in the next one.

If you would prefer, we will post a programme to you, if you enclose a self-addressed **C5** envelope and the appropriate fee with your entry form.

ALL MUSICIANS PLEASE TAKE NOTE

An "OWN CHOICE" form is required by every choir, instrumentalist and vocalist (not Dance or Speech and Drama). You should complete one for each class you enter. Attach it to your music for the adjudicator and hand it in at our Competitors' Table on arrival for your class.

"Own Choice" forms can be downloaded from the web site (FORMS tab) or we will post your "Own Choice" forms to you if you enclose a self-addressed **C5** envelope and the appropriate fee with your entry form.

<u>ADULT CHOIRS</u> can request changing facilities at the Pavilion by completing a CHOIRS DAY form, downloadable from our website. Send it in with your entry form, or you can email it back to us. Please note:- NO FORM MAY RESULT IN NO CHANGING FACILITIES.
