Winners of classes 251 to 256 will be invited to compete in this class, in which they will be expected to sing one of their winning pieces plus any piece from any OTHER class whether or not they won that other class. (i.e. you cannot just repeat your winning class songs).

A choir cannot qualify for this class twice, so a choir winning more than one class will be invited to select which class they will represent.

The choir coming second in the class not selected by the winners will then be invited to compete unless they have already qualified in another class in their own right in which case the next choir in line will be asked to compete.
